The **European project MedSTACH** aims to establish a Cyprus-based leading Centre of Excellence for archaeology and cultural heritage in the Eastern Mediterranean region, capitalising on multidisciplinary research and technological innovation. **MedSTACH's mission** is the development of the necessary scientific and technological environment for the advancement of the state-of-the-art in archaeology and cultural heritage research in Cyprus, the Eastern Mediterranean region, and beyond; this will be accomplished by strengthening regional well-springs of scientific and technological expertise, capacity for innovation, and synergies among related Science, Engineering and Technology disciplines. **MedSTACH's mission** is fully aligned with the Smart Specialisation Strategy for Cyprus, as it responds to the need for the study, protection, promotion and valorisation of Cyprus's unique archaeological wealth, as well as the development of alternative forms of thematic tourism based on cultural heritage.

The **MedSTACH proposal was ranked 1st** (attaining full marks 15/15, "Excellent") on a pan-European scale, among 208 proposals submitted to Programme "Teaming for Excellence" Phase 1, part of European Union's (EU) Horizon 2020 framework for Research and Innovation. Programme "Teaming for Excellence" (Teaming) aims at connecting -- via the creation of new (or the major upgrade of existing) Centers of Excellence -- renowned research institutions from countries with a strong tradition in Research and Innovation with institutions from countries with developing research activity, so that the latter become more competitive in securing research funds. During Teaming Phase 1, the **MedSTACH proposal** was awarded 0.4 million euros for a period of 1 year to develop a business plan for the MedSTACH Centre of Excellence. That proposal has been augmented with information showcasing financial sustainability and will be submitted for evaluation to Phase 2 of the Teaming Programme in November 2018, as **the only proposal focusing exclusively on cultural heritage**. Teaming projects will be competing for EU funding up to 15 million euros for a period of 5-7 years, under the requirement of an additional equal amount of co-funding from other sources; for Cyprus, this additional amount is pledged (under specific requirements and conditions) by the Government of Cyprus for a period of 15 years.

The **MedSTACH consortium** is coordinated by the Department of Civil Engineering and Geomatics of the Cyprus University of Technology and includes as key partners the Archaeological Research Unit of the University of Cyprus, the Department of Antiquities of Cyprus -- the national stakeholder and policy maker for cultural heritage management on the island, and the Cyprus Tourism Organisation -- the national stakeholder and policy maker for the promotion of Cyprus's touristic product. The **MedSTACH consortium** becomes a unique alliance for cultural heritage by including the Institute of Archaeology of the University College London (UCL) and the Laboratory of Geophysical-Satellite Remote Sensing and Archaeo-environment of the Foundation for Research and Technology -- Hellas (FORTH), conveying expertise in Research and Innovation from leading, internationally acclaimed, European institutions.
